CBT for PTSD: Ehlers et al (2005)

Significant cognitive themes An ability to identify the main cognitive themes that will be addressed in therapy, and aspects of the event which elicit especially strong distress ('hot spots') and their meaning An ability to identify the predominant emotions associated with trauma memories (eg guilt, anger, shame, sadness or fear)

Cognitive Therapy for Panic Disorder

a stimulus being interpreted as a sign of impending danger This interpretation produces a state of apprehension, which is associated with a wide range of bodily sensations If these anxiety-produced sensations are interpreted in a catastrophic fashion (eg indicating impending insanity, fainting, death, loss of control, etc) a

The Stroop Effect - IMBS

The Stroop effect is one of the best known phenomena in all of cognitive science and indeed in psychology more broadly It is also one of the most long standing, having been reported by John Ridley Stroop in the published version of his dissertation in 1935 [1] In its basic form, the task is to name the color in which a word is printed, ignoring the word itself When the word is a color word
