patient and family (Benner et al, 2010) Preceptor—A nurse who has had preceptor training and is assigned to work with the newly licensed nurse for the first six months of practice to provide expert feedback, to foster reflective practice, to role model safe and quality patient care, and to socialize the novice nurse into the role of a nurse The preceptor can work on a one-to-one basis
