ANALYSIS (QCA) Qualitative Comparative Analysis (QCA) is a methodology that enables the analysis of multiple cases in complex situations It can help explain why change happens in some cases but not others QCA is designed for use with an intermediate number of cases, typically between 10 and 50 It can be used in situations where there are too few cases to apply conventional statistical

A qualitative approach using telephone and face-to-face interview techniques was used to explore, in depth, the reasons for leaving teaching and to discuss potential solutions and ideas The project took place over two key phases: the first was a smaller pilot phase exploring emerging findings around key drivers and reasons for leaving, and the second consisted of full qualitative fieldwork
