Shakespeare demonstrated the Elizabethan belief that the country is stable only if the King is good and virtuous Elizabethans believed that evil

occurs in darkness, which is a recurring theme in Macbeth Shakespeare included a lot of blood and murder, which the Elizabethans expected to see in a play The play was considered a thriller –a threat to an anointed King and the perceived evil
